



Eugene B. Benson is the Executive Director of the Massachusetts Association of Conservation Commissions (MACC), a membership-based non-profit that protects Massachusetts' wetlands, open spaces, and biological diversity through education, advocacy, and support of Massachusetts conservation commissions.

Before joining MACC in 2013, Eugene was Legal Counsel and Director of the Environmental Justice Legal Services Program at Alternatives for Community & Environment in Roxbury, where his work included advising and representing residents of lower income communities and communities of color throughout Massachusetts working to improve and protect the natural and built environments and public health in their communities. His earlier positions include Associate General Counsel at Massachusetts Water Resources Authority; Executive Director of Cambridge & Somerville Legal Services; and various attorney positions in the Maryland Legal Aid Bureau.

Eugene is adjunct faculty at the Boston University Metropolitan College Graduate Program in City Planning & Urban Affairs, where he teaches courses in Planning and Land Use Law; and Environmental Law and Policy. He has co-chaired the Boston Bar Association Environmental Law Section and the section's Water Quality Committee and Public Service Committee. He also has chaired the Boards of The Food Project and the Mystic River Watershed Association, and is currently the Board chair of GreenRoots, an environmental justice non-profit in Chelsea, MA, and a member of his town's redevelopment board. Gene received his J.D. from Georgetown University Law Center.
